- MTT 202 and MST 202 are taken as a block in either the 1st or 2nd semester of the sophomore year (or 1st semester of junior year, if needed). It is not recommended that both sophomore blocks be taken in the same semester.
- It is recommended that ELE 301, SOM 203, and RAL 321 be taken as a block in the junior year (or 1st semester of senior year, if needed). In the event that this prevents the student from completing major courses, flexibility in scheduling these courses is recommended.
- ELE 490 (Student Teaching) and ELE 498 (Capstone) are taken as a block in the senior year. This is a 3 unit semester and should not be taken with any other courses. One additional unit must be taken in any May Semester, Summer Session or any other semester except Senior Student Teaching.
- LIT 310 Literature for Young Readers can be taken in place of RAL 225
